Guest Speakers

At the June 15th USAC council meeting, USAC members were first joined by Jeremy Bean from the Office of Change Management and Organizational Excellence, who provided an update on the <u>Optimized Service Teams</u> (OSTs), the new ecosystem of shared support and services across the University. Twelve past and current USAC members who work in the OST workstream areas have been designated to serve on the six work groups and help provide staff perspective to the decision-making processes. The second speaker was Justin Schwartz, Executive Vice President and Provost, who answered questions from USAC members and discussed his goals as provost. These goals fall within three categories: leading efforts for President Bendapudi's goals as part of the early stages of strategic planning, academic innovations, and organizational excellence and long-range planning

Committee Updates

- The Awards and Recognition Committee held the <u>USAC awards ceremony</u> on May 19th in Old Main. At the ceremony, three staff members were given awards and outgoing USAC members were recognized for their service.
- The Communications Committee is working on upcoming press releases, creating the USAC Annual Report, drafting the monthly meeting brief, and updating USAC's social media channels and newly redesigned <u>website</u>.
- The Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging (DEIB) Committee is working to identify potential speakers to bring in for USAC and the entire University community on DEIB topics.
- The Logistics and Events Committee helped to coordinate logistics for the June 15th community engagement meeting at the New Kensington campus.
- The Membership and Elections Committee completed selection of new members for the 2023-24 academic year. The new members will join the council and begin their 3-year term in August.
- The Outreach Committee planned the community engagement meeting on June 15th to the New Kensington campus. Campus representatives from New Kensington, Greater Allegheny, Beaver, and Shenango were in attendance physically and a representative from Fayette joined virtually for the discussion.
- The History Committee is compiling historical information regarding USAC and preparing to contribute records to the University Archives. Because available USAC historical information is limited, current or
